37. What opportunities and challenges did the congregation face in 2022?

Holy Spirit faced the opportunity to finally be fully back in person. We continue to offer online streaming and have added some of the programs we learned worked really well during the pandemic. We have experienced much new growth from people who found us online, have a new approach to their spiritual life post-pandemic, or who have come to us through our increasingly healthy parochial school. Our challenges are what might be expected post-pandemic. We still have parishioners who are hesitant to return or found new life patterns during the pandemic. Volunteerism is somewhat unmoored as norms and habits are in flux, pledging and giving are less overt or timely. Overall, we are hopeful 2023 will continue to go the way of health and new life.

38. Looking toward the future, what changes do you hope to see in your faith community? What does your community need in order to bring about these changes?

We continue to see a need to renormalize regular attendance for church events. We also have a significant number of new residents in the surrounding area that are finding their way into our church. The resources we need are financial support in order to bridge the gap between where we were and all the potential before us, especially as many people moved away during the pandemic.
